K Hello Kinder Family,

We have gotten off to a lot of fun and learning already and wanted to remind you of a few things that are happening inside our Kindergarten Classroom family.

First, don't forget that homework has started so please check your child's bag. As always, we know it's hard-to-find time at the end of a long day, but spending time helping your child do their homework is priceless. This always includes helping your child write his/her name.

Sight words are another process that should be practiced at home on a regular basis. Just let your child's teacher know if you need another copy of this year's sight words. In addition, we are very excited to introduce the Accelerated Reader Program. This is a fun and exciting to young readers so please stay tuned.

In math we are comparing numbers. In science we are learning about our 5 senses.

Don't forget that that Book Character Day will be on October 27. This is the day that your child can dress like the book character of their choice!

Also, October 31 we will celebrate Pumpkin Day! Lots of fun stuff coming soon so be sure to stay tuned.

1 Hello, First Grade Families & Happy October!

This month not only brings us the excitement of fall and Halloween, but we will also be learning lots of new and wonderful things.

In Literacy, we are already on our second unit which is Our Community!

In Math, we will be discussing 2D and 3D shapes as well as halves and fourths. We will also discuss the counting sequence. One way you can help at home is to practice counting to 100 every night.

In Science, we will learn about different kinds of motion, including the forces of push and pull.

In Social Studies, we will learn about economics. Finally, we will continue to work on math and reading skills in iReady. It's sure to be a great month!

Please note that we do not wear costumes to school for Halloween. As always, we are very grateful for your support. Please reach out to your child's teacher should you have any concerns or questions.

2 Happy Fall! We are so proud of the 2nd grade students! They are doing a great job with their homework, which is given on Tuesday and due on the following Tuesday. This allows students to have an entire week to complete their homework. Please make sure your child's homework has been checked before returning it on Tuesday.

To develop great habits, we are encouraging our students to answer all questions in complete sentences on classwork and homework when writing and speaking.

The students have been reading a variety of fun stories and learning how to identify the central idea, relevant details and the theme. Remember reading 20 minutes each night is part of the 2nd grade homework. As you read with your child at home, encourage them to talk about the stories. "Great readers think and read."

In math we will continue to work on addition and subtraction facts -100 as well as word problems. Extra practice on learning basic math fact fluency will help your child in future skills.

Second graders can check out books from our Media center. This year the students are allowed to get two books and take them home. Please help your child to remember to bring them back in a timely manner. When their books are returned they can check out new ones. We are encouraging them to check out books on their level and use these books to take AR tests which earns them points and builds their comprehension skills.

Keep your eyes open for our first IN HOUSE FIELD TRIP FORM and PARENT AUTHORIZATION FORM to come home. The students will have an opportunity to experience Sawgrass a Native American Indian. When the FIELD TRIP form does come home, please fill it out and return it promptly to your child's teacher.



We will end this month with our annual Trunk or Treat which will be held on October 27 at 5:30-7:30.

Eagle Press: Intermediate Classes

3 Third graders are busy, busy, busy as we begin our third month in 3rd grade. In ELA students will be able to explain how text features contribute to the meaning of texts. Students will continue to identify an author's claim and explain how an author uses evidence to support the claim. We will begin to compare and contrast how two authors present information on the same topic. Students will form and use complete sentences. For the writing component, students will plan an argumentative/opinion writing paragraph. In Social Studies, students will continue map skills learning how to find places in the United States.

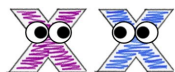
In Math we are finishing up our unit on building our knowledge of multiplication facts. We've been working hard on learning our x0, x1, x2, x5, x9 and x10 facts. These facts are introduced to third graders at this time but should be worked on all year long to gain fluency. In your next unit this month, we will be focusing on place value. In Science we are still working on the properties of matter unit. Our knowledge of the properties of matter will assist us as we investigate how matter changes. Please continue to monitor your child's homework, have them read 20 minutes, and check their take-home folders nightly.

4 Happy fall! Our 4th graders are off to a fantastic start!

In ELA, we are moving on to our second Unit in the Wonders curriculum! This unit focuses on theme and character development in literary stories and central idea and relevant details for informational texts. Students will be looking closely at text features and how they add meaning to texts.

In writing, we have begun working on completing essays. Our first Writing Assessment will be this month which will us and students closely monitor their growth throughout the year!

In math, students are continuing to with multi-digit multiplication and will begin division. The RAMP students will be working on fractions, equivalent fractions and comparing fractions. To help with multi-digit multiplication, please continue to practice multiplication facts to develop fluency. Flash cards and online games are great practice!



In social studies, we are taking a look at the Southeast region of the United States and Florida's geography and what makes Florida a special place. In science our students will be learning about the different forms of energy and how sound travels. The Fourth grade St. Augustine Field Trip activity fees form went home last month. Please return the form as soon as possible. Payments can be made through My Schoolbucks.

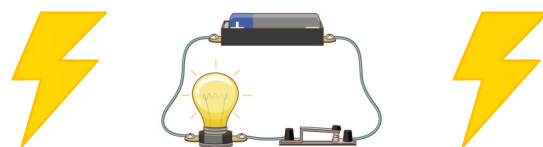
5 Happy Fall y'all! We have wrapped up our first Fast test and all scores are available to view. Now our push to Thanksgiving break! 5th graders are loving their new playground and could really use some donations of sports equipment, including soccer and kick balls. Here is what we are learning in October:

In ELA our students will start Unit 2 learning to explain how text structures and features can contribute to the overall meaning of the texts. This will include identifying the specific claim(s), evidence and reasoning and responding to a writing prompt gathering information from a text.

In Social Studies we are starting to investigate the challenges of early English settlements in North America (Roanoke, Jamestown, Plymouth) We will compare the New England, Middle, and Southern colonies and be able to explain the impact of slavery in the Americas. Students will describe the social, political, and economic aspects of daily life in colonial America.

In Math we will start with the review of multiplication and division of multi-digit whole numbers. We will then use our previous lessons of multi digit decimals and start to multiply and divide these decimals.

We will be electrifying in science as we learn about electricity! We will perform inquiries on multiple types of electricity and learn about circuits, conductors, and insulators. Later in the month, we will take a break from new content and review prior knowledge in preparation for our first district benchmark assessment.



RAMP 4 & 5

October finds RAMP4 students delving into the world of fractions with a focus on operations with fractions. They begin the month by adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators, including mixed numbers and fractions greater than 1. The rest of October RAMP4 students will explore multiplying and dividing fractions by a whole number and multiplying and dividing whole numbers by a unit fraction.

5th grade RAMP newsletter for October

In October RAMP5 students will plot, order, and compare positive and negative rational numbers using vertical and horizontal number lines. They will learn the absolute value of a number by stating how far a number and its opposite are from zero. Students will also apply this knowledge in a mathematical or real-world context when talking about distances, temperatures, finances, etc.

Music

The music room has been filled with lots of beautiful music these past few weeks with the sounds of voices, ukulele, xylophones and unpitched instruments. Third, fourth, and fifth grade students have been improvising and reading music, while second, first, and kindergarten have been exploring the timbre of many different instruments. Ask your child if he or she can name a few.

Fifth graders have been preparing for their field trip to the Dr. Phillips Center for the Performing Arts in Downtown Orlando on October 21st. During this performance, our students will see performances by the Orlando Philharmonic Orchestra, Orlando Ballet, and the Orlando Opera.

The end of October also brings "Glow Week" to the music room. We cover the windows, turn off the lights and crank up the music for our glow-in-the-dark music lesson.

Our Eastbrook Chorus is excited to be performing at the Orlando Solar Bears game on October 26. It is definitely going to be an exciting month!



PE For the month of October, students will be learning Soccer and Basketball. They'll learn fundamentals and rules of the games which will be followed by fun and cognitive thinking games.



The students will learn about Offense and Defensive strategies to help them become more successful



Art Corner



This month we are working on a lot of new skills and techniques. 4th and 5th grade students are working on sewing emoji and monster pillows. They will bring them home soon!

2nd and 3rd grade students are weaving yarn on a loom they painted and warped.

1st grade is practicing painting landscapes with lots of texture, and kindergarten is learning all about "line." We will also start our fall themed projects this month. Thank you for your continued support!

What is parent & Family Engagement (PFEP) in Title 1, Part A Programs?

Parent and Family Engagement (PFE) in a child's education is a greater predictor of academic success than whether or not that family is affluent or poor. That's why Title I, Part A program regulations insist on robust parent and family engagement activities at every school where federal funds support effective teaching and engaged learning.

What Is Parent and Family Engagement?

Currently Title I, Part A defines parent involvement as the *...participation of parents in regular, two-way and meaningful communications with school staff that involves the student, addresses learning and engages the family in school activities.*

The Title I, Part A classification of parent involvement derives from the definition of Parent and Family Engagement, as outlined in the Every Student Succeeds Act, circa 2017-2018.

Why Does Parent and Family Engagement Matter?

Research tells us that students with engaged parents and families, are more likely to:

- **Learn to read** faster (Exhibit faster rates of literacy acquisition.)
- Have **higher grades** and test scores.
- Are promoted and **take more challenging classes.**
- Adapt better to school and have **better attendance.**
- Have **better social skills** and behavior.

- **Graduate.**
- Go on to community/technical **college or university** and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps.



Key Questions to Ask at Your Child's School

To find out if your child is getting an education that will prepare him or her for success, consider asking the following questions related to specific areas of school performance:

- ✓ **Quality:** Is my child getting a great education? › How will you keep me informed about how my child is doing on a regular basis? How can we work together if my child falls behind? › Is my child on grade level, and on track to be ready for college and a career? How do I know?
- ✓ **Ready for Success:** Will my child be prepared to succeed in whatever comes next? › How will you measure my child's progress and ability in subjects including reading, math, science, the arts, social and emotional development, and other activities? › How much time will my child spend preparing for and taking state and district tests? How will my child's teacher and I know how to use the results to help my child make progress?

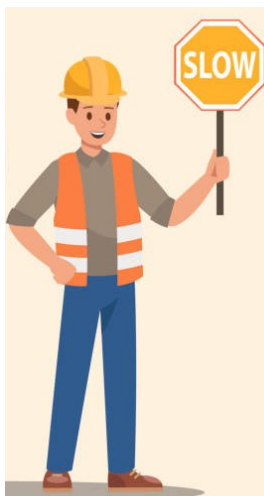
